Insurers pay at least \$3.6 billion each year to treat diseases and conditions preventable by breastfeeding. Breast feeding is a low-cost, low-tech, preventive health strategy that can address chronic health issues for both mother and baby and have a lifelong impact. The Lactation Supportive Environments Initiative (LSE) provides services for obesity prevention by increasing

access to environments that support the initiation and duration of breastfeeding by increasing the number of breastfeeding-friendly community health centers, businesses and schools that adopt policies supportive of breastfeeding.


