






### Dimensions of Food Access











#### **Availability:**

Is the food supply physically here?

#### **Accessibility:**

Where is the grown, sold, or otherwise provided?
Can I get there easily? Do they deliver, curbside pickup?

### **Affordability:**

How much does the food cost? Do I have enough money?

### Accommodation:

Are my needs met here? Can I use SNAP EBT or WIC?


#### Acceptability:

Is this quality food?
Is this relevant to my






