-  Raise **\$250,000 by Jan 1, 2025**, to invest in urban agriculture in San Diego County. **This will match our \$250,000.**
-  Fund **13 additional urban agriculture projects** for a total of:
 - 20 awards of \$10,000 each**
 - 6 awards of \$50,000 each**
-  Offer **technical assistance to help urban growers be successful** in San Diego County.



The Urban Food Equity Unit at UC San Diego Center for Community Health aims to improve food access and health equity by building upon neighborhood-level food assets and strengths. **Our projects focus on community-driven solutions to build food sovereignty.** We prioritize capacity building services, resource development, research activities, and engagement for and with communities of color and low-income communities in San Diego County. We utilize the [California Climate Investments Priority Populations](#) to guide our service area. We focus on urban agriculture, food access, and training the next generation of food equity leaders.
