#### What We Do

The Healthy Works: Nutrition Education and Obesity Prevention (NEOP) Program strives to create environments conducive to healthy living for SNAP\* eligible individuals and families. Through education and environmental changes, the NEOP program empowers this group to consume more healthy foods and beverages, limit consumption of less healthy options, and be more active in the settings where they live, learn, shop, and work. NEOP is working with the following local partners in its community effort to reduce obesity: Circulate San Diego; Home Start Inc.; International Rescue Committee, San Diego; YMCA Childcare Resource Service; University of California, San Diego--Center for Community Health.

### **Health Equity**

NEOP is the largest Healthy Works program working specifically in vulnerable, low-income communities to reduce the burden of chronic disease and promoting an equal opportunity for health among all San Diegans.

## What We've Accomplished

In 2015, Healthy Works NEOP program and its partners made the following impacts:

#### LIVE

More than 8,300 residents in San Diego County had more access to healthy foods and safe active living opportunities in their neighborhoods.

#### LEARN

Over 14,500 students in San Diego County had increased access to nutrition education, healthy food options, and safer routes to school.

#### SHOP

63,500 SNAP-Ed Adults in San Diego County had access to increased opportunities for healthy food options in their neighborhood.

#### WORK

1,900 employees of local businesses in San Diego County benefitted from improved workplace wellness policies that create more opportunities for healthy nutrition and physical activity.

#### **Place Matters**

The Healthy Works NEOP program is going beyond educating individuals and families on how to eat healthy and be active; we are also shaping neighborhood settings that foster health through a combination of individual, environmental and community level projects.
